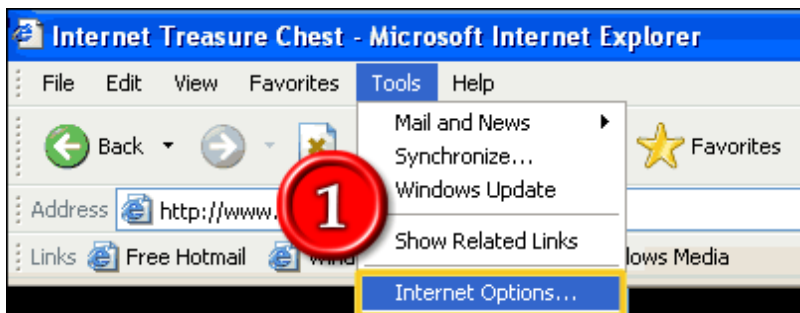
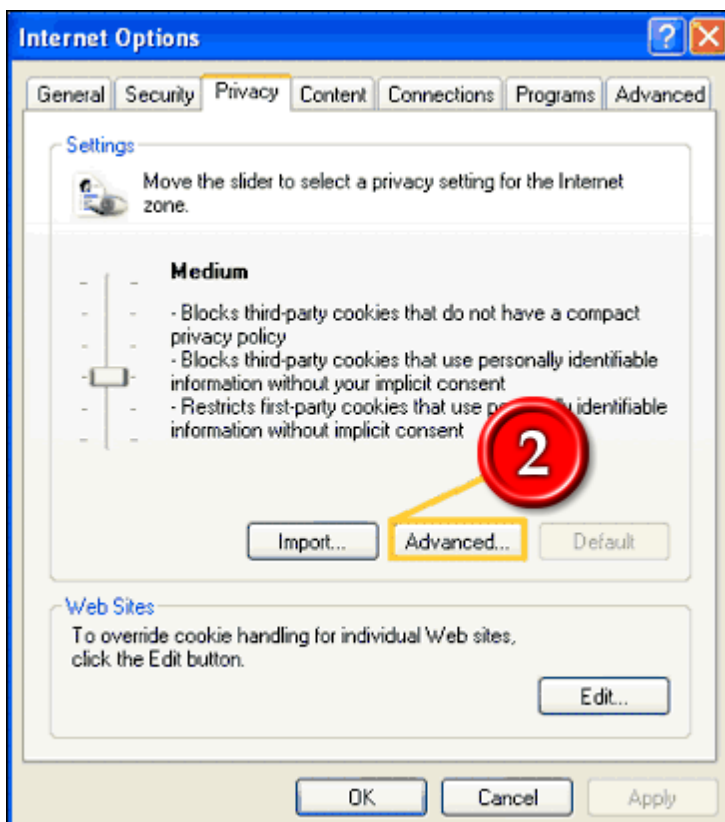


- 1 Open internet explorer, and from the **Tools** menu, click **Internet Options**.



- 2 From the **Privacy** tab, click **Advanced**.





- 3 To adjust the settings, click to select **Override automatic cookie handling**.



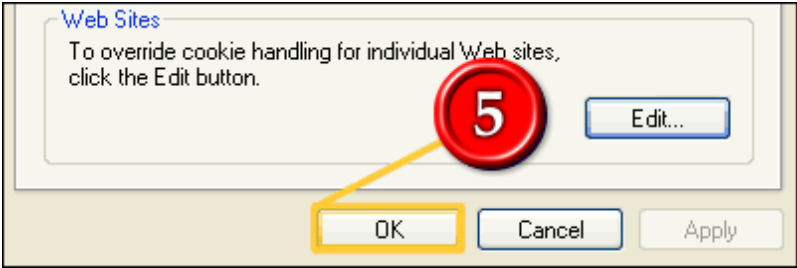
4 Click to choose **Accept** first-party cookies, and third-party cookies.



 First party cookies come from the site you are visiting, for example Yahoo.

 Third party cookies come from a third party who has permission from the site you are visiting to send cookies to you. For example, Yahoo allows Casino.com to send cookies to your computer.

5 Click **Ok** then restart internet explorer.



ENABLE COOKIES IN IE7

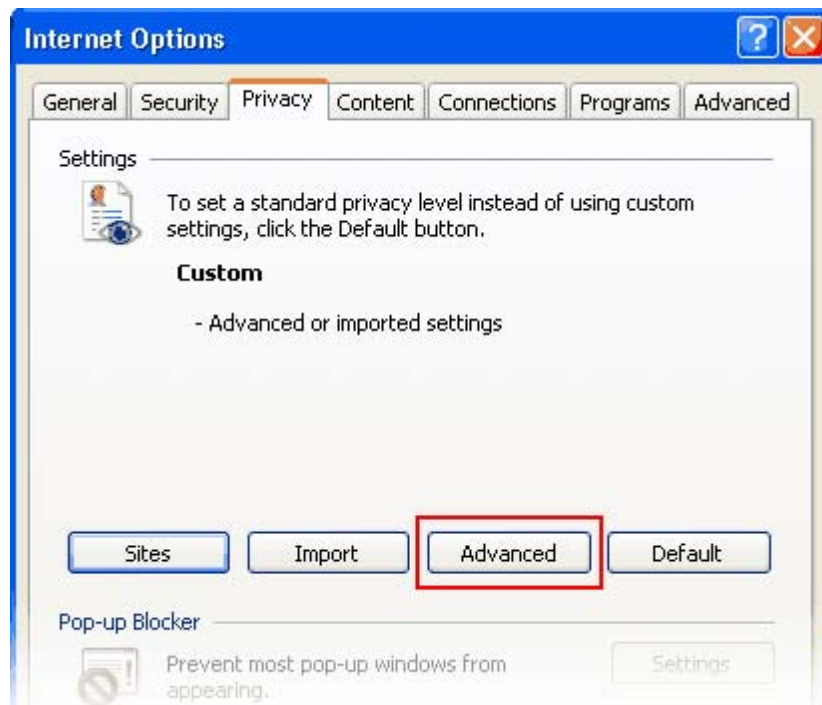
1. Start Internet Explorer
2. Under the "Tools" menu, click "Internet Options"



3. Click the "Privacy" tab



4. Click the "Advanced" button



5. Put a check mark in the box for “Override Automatic Cookie Handling”, put another check mark in the “Always accept session cookies” box.



6. Click “OK”



7. Click "OK"



7. Restart Internet Explorer

ENABLE COOKIES IN FIREFOX

1. Go to **Tools > Options**.
2. Select the **Privacy** tab.
3. Expand the **Cookies** item. (In Firefox 1.5, select the **Cookies** tab.)
4. Check the check box that's labeled **Allow sites to set cookies**.



Whether you choose to allow cookies, or disallow them, you can always make exceptions, but clicking the **Exceptions** button. There you can enter a web address (the URL of the site you want to block or allow) and select either **Block**, **Allow for Session** (allow until you close and reopen Firefox) or **Allow**. You can also remove any site from that list.
